



# Oak Grove Fire/Public Safety Committee Regular Session Meeting Minutes Thursday, April 10, 2025 Oak Grove Council Chambers

#### CALL TO ORDER

The Regular Session of the Oak Grove Fire/Public Safety Committee was called to order by Chairperson Edward Cook at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, April 10, 2025, in the Oak Grove Council Chambers at 8505 Pembroke Oak Grove Road, Oak Grove, Kentucky.

## **ROLL CALL**

The following members were present:

Police Chief Dennis Cunningham, Fire Chief Bill Johnson, and City Clerk Lorelynn Fisher were also present. Approximately three members of the public were in attendance.

#### **REVIEW OF MINUTES**

Committee Member John Campbell moved to approve the minutes from the January 9, 2025, meeting, seconded by Committee Member Isaiah Spencer. No discussion followed, and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

## **AGENDA ITEMS**

1. Capital Outlay for Police and Fire: The Police Department's capital outlay has not changed since the January discussion. However, Chief Cunningham mentioned the potential purchase of a \$12,000 motor for a vehicle, as well as plans to acquire one new vehicle. The Fire Department's capital outlay has not changed since the January discussion. Chief Johnson mentioned the need to purchase or save for a new fire

- truck. Discussion was also held regarding boats for preparedness of natural disasters. Committee Member John Campbell moved the approval of a boat to city council, seconded by Chairperson/Committee Member Edward Cook. No discussion followed, and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.
- 2. Hydrants-Painting: Chairperson/Committee Member Edward Cook noted that some hydrants are in need of painting. The topic prompted additional discussion, but no official action was taken.
- 3. Pavement-Fire Department: Funding for the paving is included in the Fire Department's capital outlay. The committee agreed that the back side of the Fire Department should be repaided but decided to postpone work on the front side due to the state's upcoming widening of Highway 911. No official action was taken.

Additional topics discussed included roof leaks at the Fire Department and the use of storage containers.
