- Meeting held with McGhee Engineering regarding the water tank; bidding is expected to be published next month or later.
- Awaiting response from Delta Regional regarding the grant.
- Consideration of Ground-Penetrating Radar Quotes-KIA Grant
 (Ground-penetrating radar (GPR) is a non-invasive technique that uses electromagnetic waves to create images of what lies beneath the surface. It produces a continuous, real-time view of

underground features in soil and rock layers. Public Works Department could use this technology tool for safety, planning, and efficiency in infrastructure work): Following discussion was held: Director Ahart stated that the purchase of the ground-penetrating radar will be covered by KIA grant funds and noted that Tracer Electronics is preferable due to its local availability.
