A SUMMARY OF AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY OF OAK GROVE, KENTUCKY
AMENDING ORDINANCE 2020-14 ESTABLISHING AN ETHICAL CODE OF CONDUCT
FOR CITY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE OAK GROVE CITY COUNCIL AS
FOLLOWS:

By summary, this ordinance amends the Oak Grove Ethical Code of Conduct by adding sections regarding social media, executive session, and the delivery of notice of noncompliance with financial statement filing requirements. Specifically, City of Oak Grove Ordinance No. 2020-14 shall be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 22. Social Media.

- (A) City officials [including members of boards, commissions, etc.] can maintain a personal presence on social media. However, to be considered personal, there can be no mention of their status as a city official. Any mention of their status as a city official potentially changes the nature of the page, requiring record keeping in accordance with the Kentucky Department of Library and Archives retention schedule and subjecting the entire page to Open Records requests.
- (B) Elected city officials who want to interact with the community on social media in their role as city official are required to maintain a separate account. City officials will notify the city clerk of any official page(s) utilized. The city clerk will maintain an updated list of official pages of city officials.
- (C) City officials shall conduct themselves professionally and as a representative of the city.
- (D) Elected city official pages shall clearly indicate that any content posted or submitted for posting is subject to public disclosure. Additionally, guidelines, shall be posted conspicuously on the page.
- (E) No comments shall be deleted unless in violation of posted guidelines. Deleted comments shall be provided to the city clerk and must be saved for one year.
- (F) City officials shall not conduct city business through their social media sites. If receiving a specific request from a citizen, the city official shall state: "Thank you for your question. Please email me at [official email address] or contact me at [phone number]. I look forward to speaking with you."

- (G) Elected officials shall not discuss issues pending before the council. Elected officials may illicit public input but shall not respond to comments. Engaging in substantive conversations on social media could require retention of the posts and may violate the Open Meetings Act if other elected officials are also engaging in the discussion.

SECTION 23. Email.

- (A) City officials shall maintain an official email address and shall provide the email address to the city clerk. This must be separate from their personal email account.
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- (C) City officials shall retain emails according to the Kentucky Department of Library and Archives schedule for emails. City officials shall direct any record keeping questions to the city clerk.

SECTION 24. Executive Session

All information obtained by any city official or employee during executive session shall be kept confidential, and no city official or employee shall reveal any information obtained during executive session of any governmental meeting.

SECTION[27] 30. Noncompliance with Filing Requirement.

- (A) The Ethics Board, or the designated administrative official, shall notify by [~~certified~~] hand delivery or by mail each person required to file a statement of financial interests who fails to file the statement by the due date, files an incomplete statement, or files a statement in a form other than that prescribed by the Board. The notice shall specify the type of failure or delinquency, shall establish a date by which the failure or delinquency shall be remedied, and shall advise the person of the penalties for a violation.





Nashville SC shuts out Chicago 3-0

Nashville SC (5-3-3) hosted the Chicago Fire FC (2-3-5) on Saturday night at Geodis Park. Shortly before the eight-minute mark, Hany Mukhtar had a good shot, but it was stopped by an opposing Chicago defender.

There were chances around for both sides, especially Nashville SC and despite the four minutes of added time at the end of the first half, the defense for both teams prevented any chances until Chicago committed a penalty during added time. This resulted in a penalty kick for Nashville SC's Hany Mukhtar three minutes into added time, which he converted to give them a 1-0 lead. Right after the goal, a man ran on the field and made it to about midfield before getting apprehended by security.

In the second half, just after the 56-minute mark, Nashville SC goalkeeper Joe Willis made a tremendous save on a shot from a Chicago Fire player, Hany Mukhtar would have a good chance around the 65-minute mark, but Chicago Fire FC goalkeeper Chris Brady swallowed it up. Then moments later, Nashville SC's Jacob Shaffelburg blazed down the field with the ball with his insatiable fast speed but was tripped up by a Chicago defender as he closed in on the goal, resulting in

a penalty. Nashville SC would elect for Mukhtar to take the penalty shot, which he'd again convert for a 2-0 lead as the clock clicked into the 70-minute mark. Shortly after the 90-minute mark early into stoppage time, Mukhtar made it a hat trick on a rebound shot after Fafa Picault launched a shot that was deflected by Brady. The hat trick was Mukhtar's third in his career and second against Chicago after scoring one against them during the 2021 season. His goal also marked his sixth on the season. Nashville SC would claim the 3-0 shutout victory and finish with the lead in shots on goal 11-3.

With the victory over Chicago, Nashville jumped of Atlanta United FC into third place in the Eastern Conference.

Nashville SC head coach Gary Smith touched on Shaffelburg's ability to draw the penalty and said that when he was subbed off, he was absolutely winded and physically, had put everything he had into the game.

"It wasn't until we saw what was a fantastic individual run from almost the halfway line again that we've seen before and he earned the second penalty that he really got his just desserts for some of the efforts and the energies that he put into the game," Smith said on Shaffelburg's performance.

His speed is one of a kind and something that is seen almost every game with how he blazes past defenders with

the ball sometimes like he did Saturday night, draws a penalty.

"I thought he was absolutely fantastic," Smith said.

Lucas MacNaughton made his Nashville SC home debut after being acquired in a trade with Toronto FC shortly before the window closed with Smith saying that he was absolutely fantastic. With Walker Zimmerman having been out Saturday night, Smith said that MacNaughton was able to fill some very big shoes extremely well.

"I thought he was aggressive, he was a presence back there when needed, he was very calm on the ball and it was looked at how he played and how he fit in, you would've thought he'd been here for two or three seasons," Smith said.

While it was a team effort on the field and MacNaughton had a good Nashville SC debut, it was Hany Mukhtar who really stood out and prior to the match, he was given the captain's armband.

"It's always an honor to be the captain, it's an amazing feeling and of course comes with it responsibility, but I think

in general we did a good job, the whole team and that was a very important victory for us," Mukhtar said.

Mukhtar had a couple of assists last game and said that it was good to be back on the scoring sheet. He said it was important for them to get back-to-back victories and that they controlled the game from the first to the last minute.

With his hat trick, he said he watched the videos the team posted

about his hat trick in 2021 and that it's good motivation.

"Every game I try to give my best and I'm happy to help the team with three goals," Mukhtar said.

Nashville SC has a US Open Cup match Wednesday May 10 as they host FC Dallas at 7:30 p.m. before they return to regular season action Saturday May 13 with a match on the road against DC United with kickoff set for 6:30 p.m.

SUMMARY
NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOPKINSVILLE, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION ONE
Pursuant to KRS 82.405 this section identifies the property owners abutting the portions of the alley to be closed as WB Properties SE, LLC and the Hopkinsville and Christian County Landbank Authority. It further acknowledges the abutting property owners were given written notice of the proposed closing and the property owners gave written, notarized consent to the alley closing.
