



**Oak Grove Fire/Public Safety Committee

CALL TO ORDER

The Special Session of the Oak Grove Fire/Public Safety Committee was called to order by Chairperson John Campbell at 4:00 p.m. in the Oak Grove Council Chambers at 8505 Pembroke Oak Grove Road, Oak Grove, Kentucky.

AGENDA ITEMS

- **Update on Grants**

Lynch: Reported that he is currently working on a grant application. Sgt. Cobb has been sent to attend grant-writing classes. Lynch stated that this grant appears to have a strong possibility of being awarded to the Police Department. The grant would provide significant funding and would allow CAD systems to be installed in each police cruiser.

Johnson: Reported that there are no grants currently in progress. The department previously applied for a grant earlier in the year and is currently awaiting a response.

- **Update on Equipment Status**

Johnson: Reported that the truck involved in a rear-end collision on the interstate approximately two months ago is still awaiting parts. The ladder truck is currently undergoing its annual certification. Once completed, the springs and suspension will be replaced, and Truck 251 will then be sent in for rear-end repairs. All other equipment is currently in service and operational.

Lynch: Reported that several vehicles are currently having windshields replaced. With the exception of surplus Police Department vehicles, the department's fleet is in good condition. The department may consider purchasing additional vehicles next year based on mileage and the condition of current vehicles.

- **Update on Staff**

Lynch: Reported that the Police Department is currently staffed with 16 officers, with authorization for up to 24 officers. He stated that he would be comfortable operating with a staffing level of 22 officers. The department is currently reviewing three already-certified individuals as potential hires.

Johnson: Reported that the department currently has 30 members on the roster, with 10 applications currently under review. New members will be required to complete a 20-hour training class. The maximum roster capacity is 40 members based on available equipment and gear.
